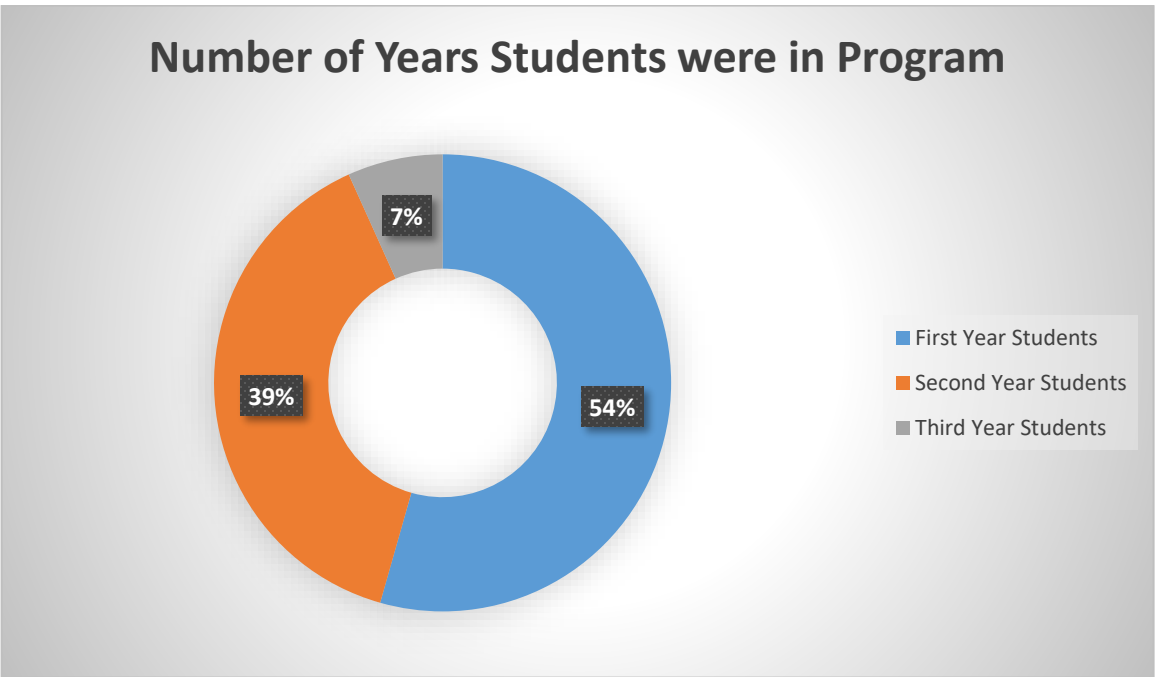
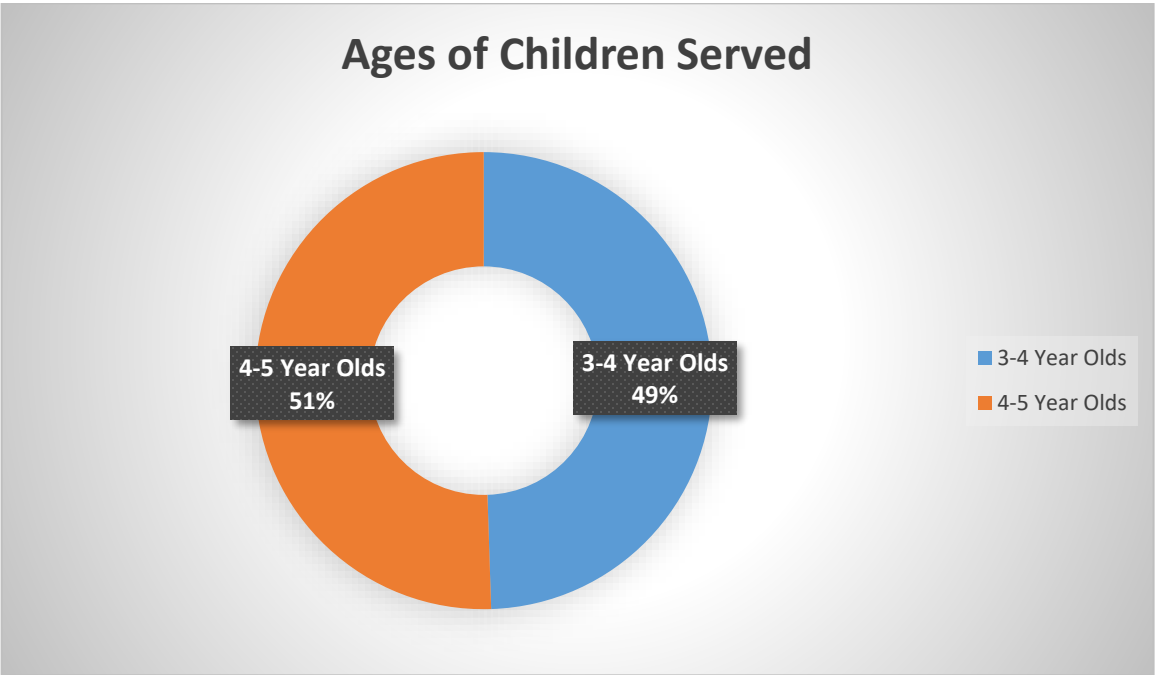

Children and Families Served

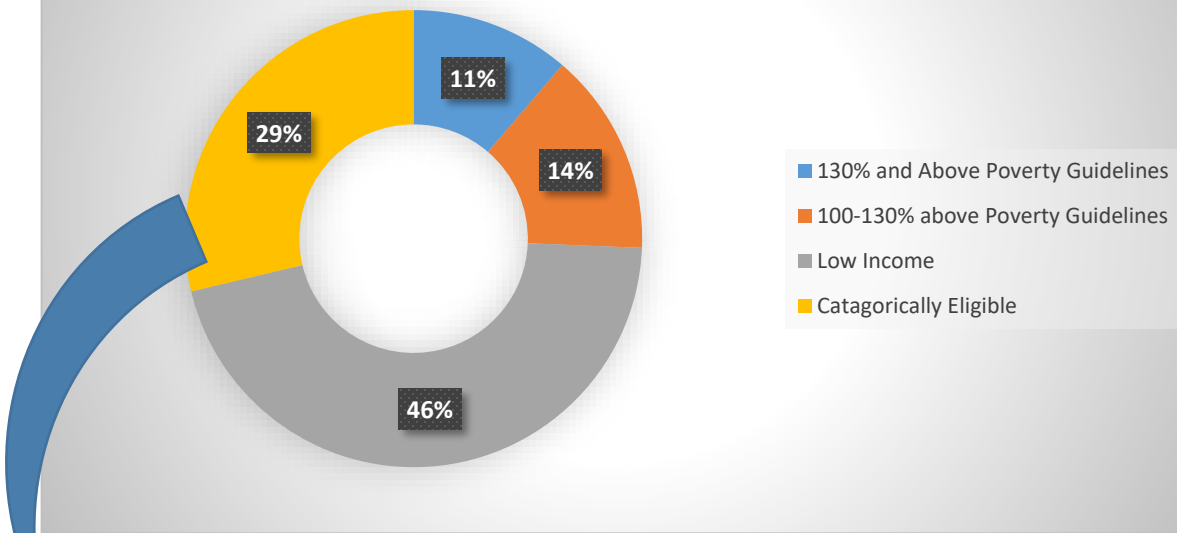
Tri-County CAP Head Start Provided services to 192 children and their families in the 2020-2021 Program Year. Children are eligible to attend Head Start upon their 3rd birthday and may remain in the program until they are eligible for Kindergarten.



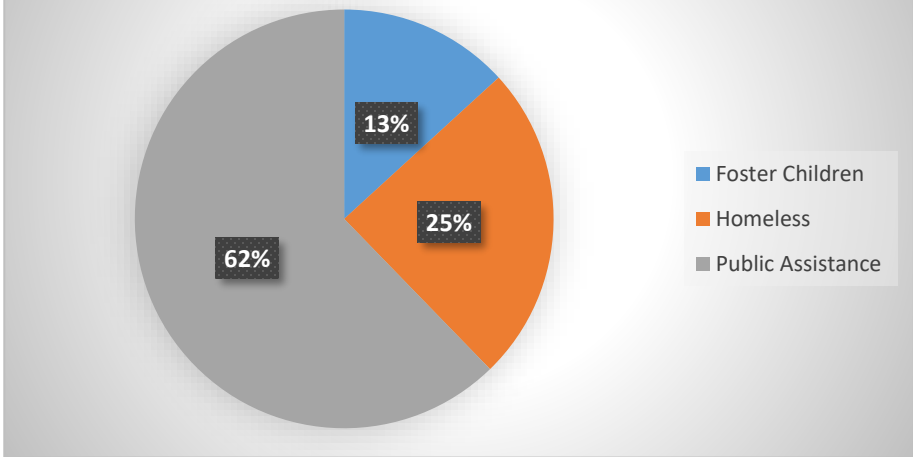
Children and Families Served

Head Start offers preschool and family development services to income eligible families. The Head Start ERSEA Manager reviews family applications and enrolls classrooms using a needs based criteria.

Enrollment Eligibility

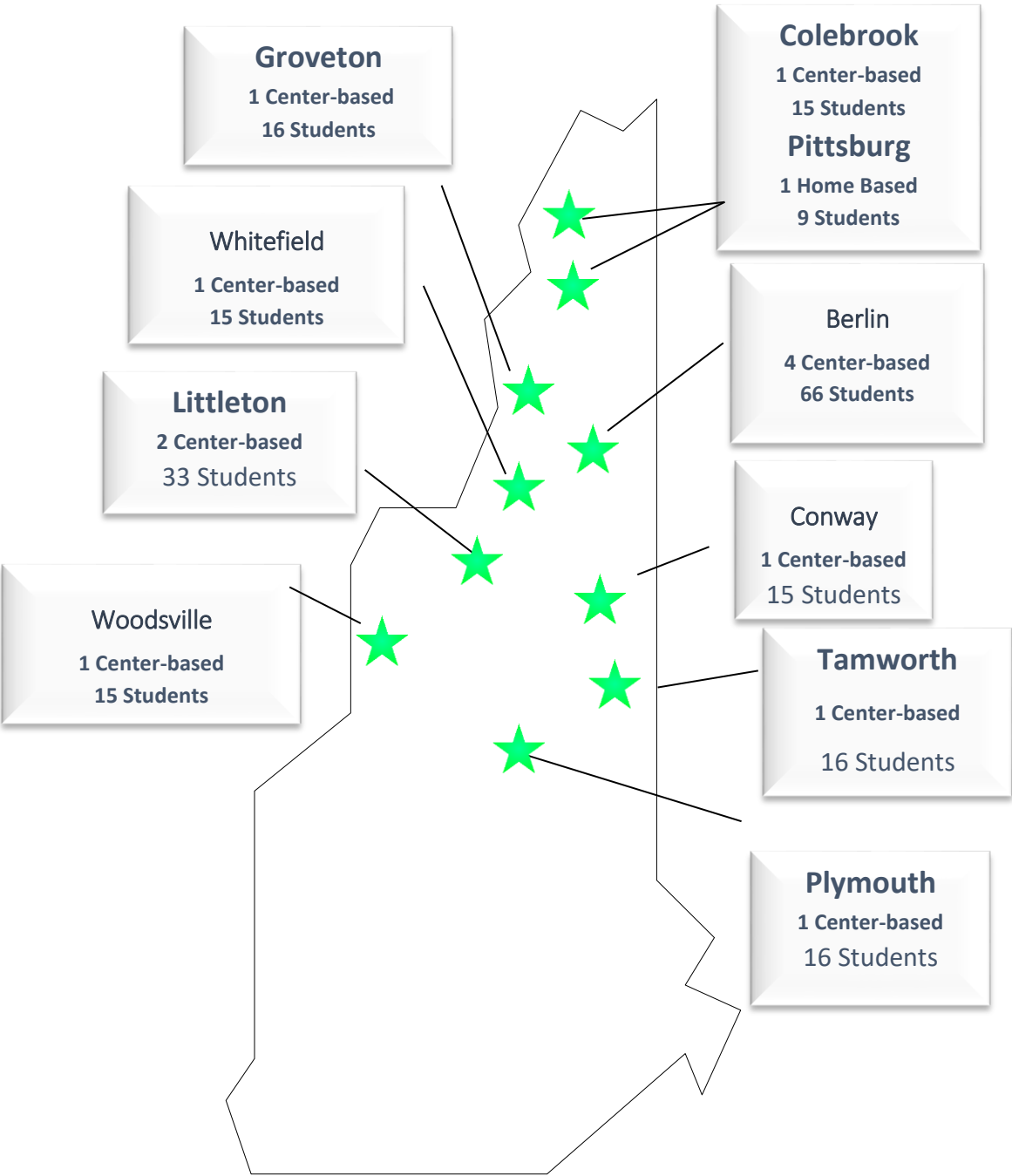


Explanation of Catagorically Eligible

Child Outcomes and School Readiness

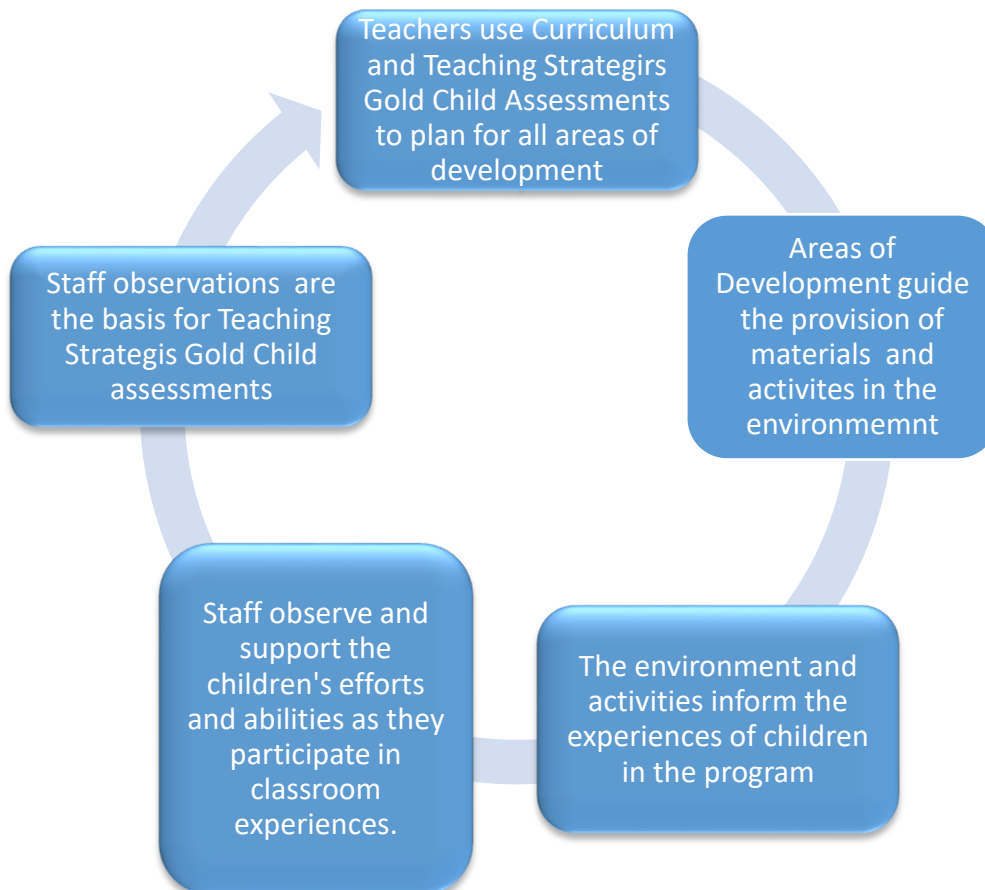
Tri County CAP Head Start focuses on school readiness and efforts to prepare children for kindergarten; TCCHS recognizes that school readiness supports lifelong success for children.

TCCHS utilizes *The Creative Curriculum® for Preschool*, a comprehensive, research-based, research-proven, curricula featuring exploration and discovery as a way of learning.



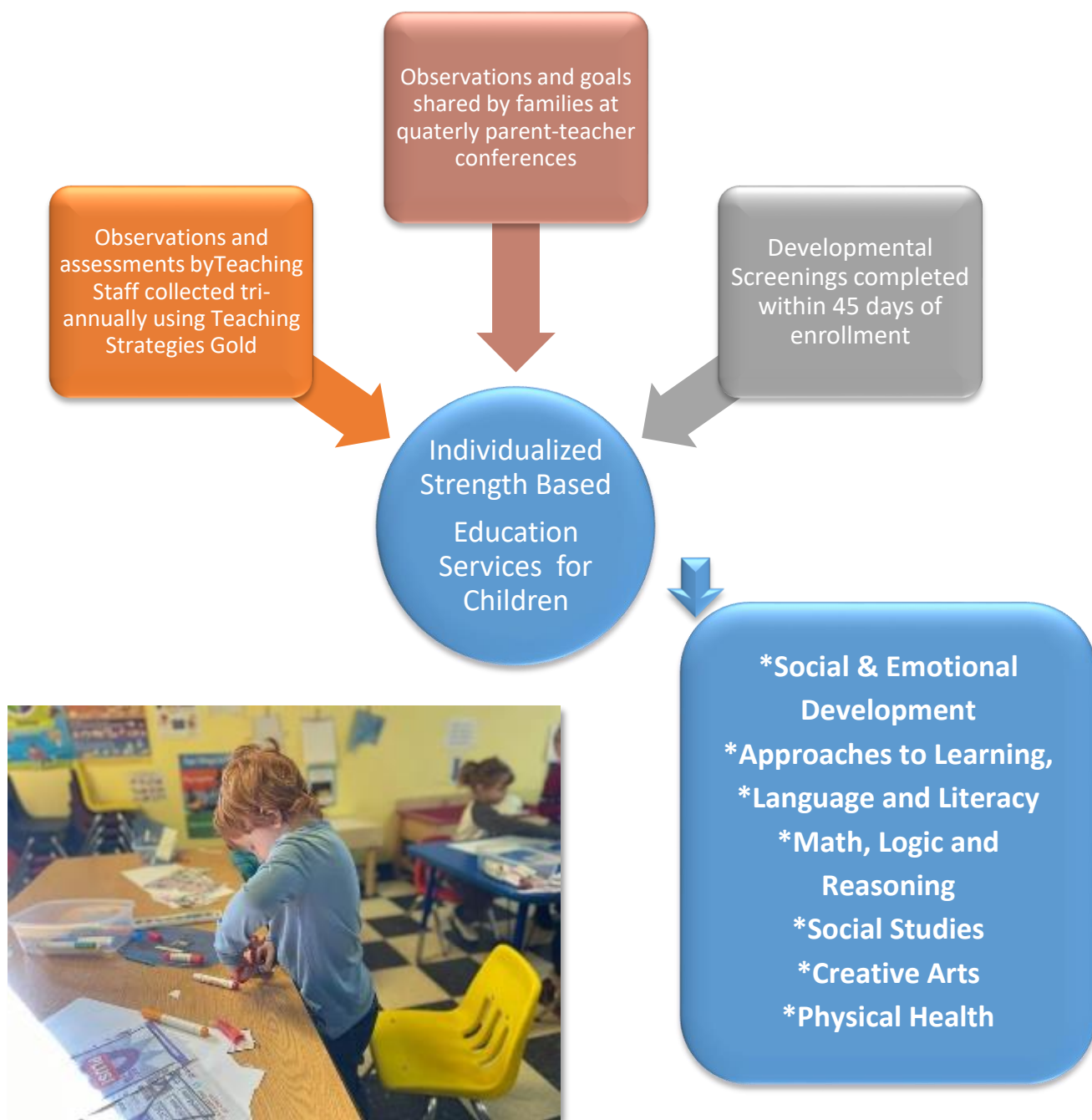
Fundamental Principles of the Creative Curriculum

- ♣ Social-emotional competence is a significant factor in school success;
- ♣ Constructive, purposeful play supports essential learning;
- ♣ The physical environment affects the type and quality of learning interactions
- ♣ Teacher-family partnerships promote development and learning.



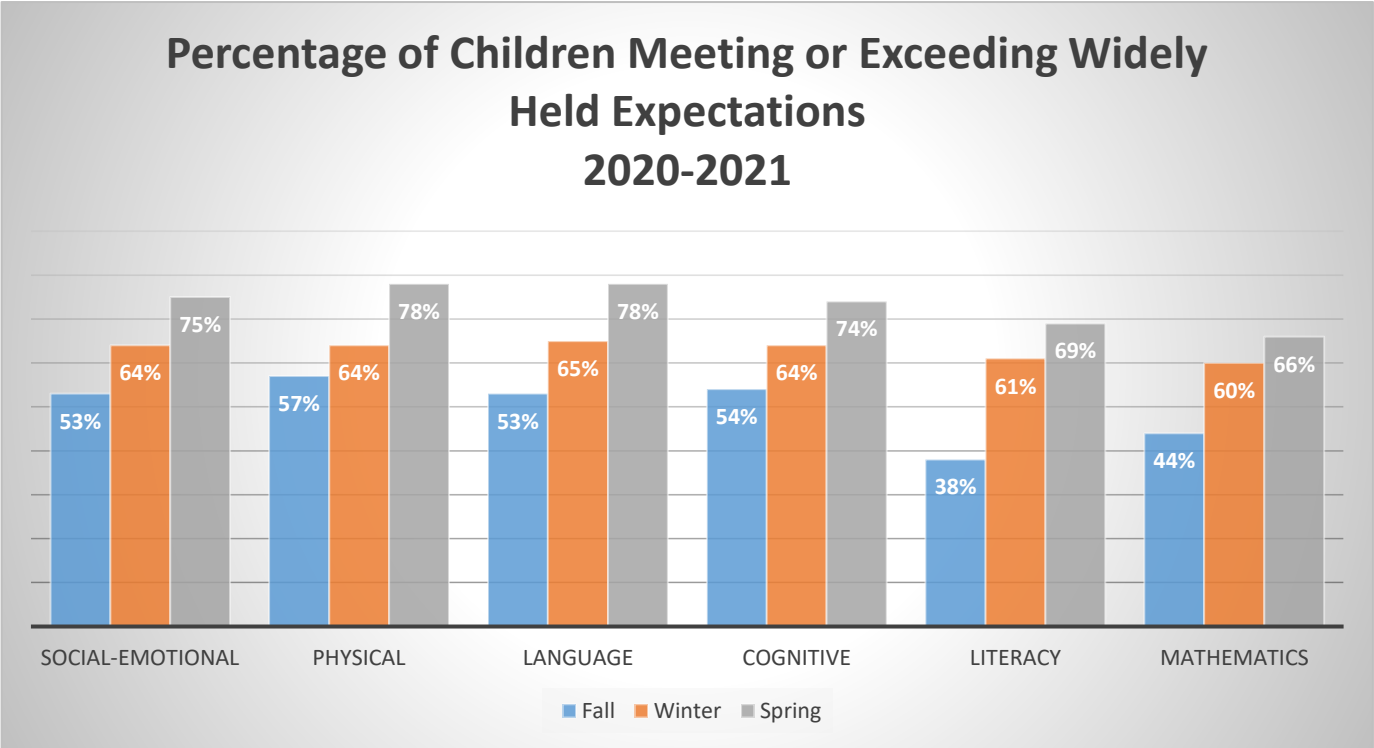
Child Outcomes and School Readiness

Child outcomes data is shared with all staff, families and Policy Council outlining strengths and areas for improvement. Staff and families review child specific reports to share each child's strengths and set goals together.



Child Outcomes and School Readiness

Teaching Strategies GOLD is used to track and measure school readiness goals. Individual Child, Classroom, and Program profile reports are generated to help guide curriculum for specific groups, and identify areas for support and supervision. The Education Manager analyzes data and generates individual classroom and program-wide TS GOLD reports three times per program year. Child outcomes data is shared with all staff, families and Policy Council outlining strengths and areas for improvement.



Child Outcomes and School Readiness

High quality teachers positively affect Child Outcomes and School Readiness. Tri County CAP Head Start ensures that teachers are obtaining the skills and support to provide a high quality classroom and successful environment for children by providing ongoing monitoring, training and support with Teaching Strategies Gold, CLASS and Active Supervision.

Services

The Head Start Health & Safety Manager, Nutrition Services Manager, and Disabilities & Behavioral Health Manager all work closely with the local LEAs, Mental Health Services, and other community health organizations to provide high quality health and nutrition services to children and families. They also work collaboratively with Head Start Family Workers to connect parents to resources in the community in order to get their immediate, short and long term needs met.

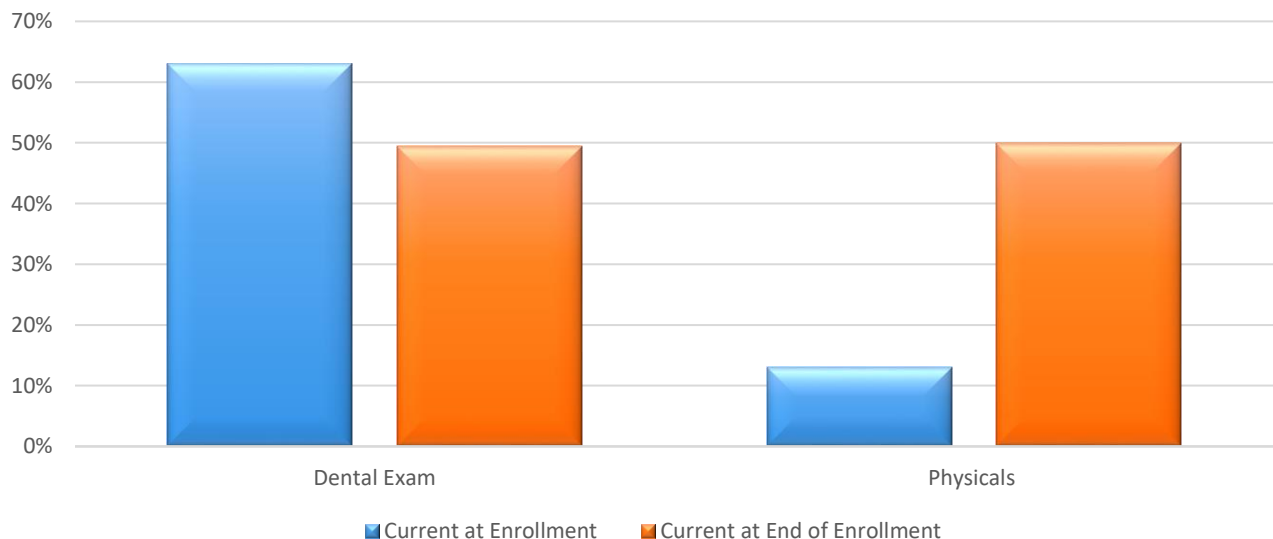


Children with current dental exams increased 12% in the 2019-2020 Program Year

Children with up to date immunizations increased 12% in the 2019-2020 Program Year

As of March 2020 all enrolled children had physicals. At the end of the program year 86% of students had physicals. 30 students were unable to attend well child checks on time due to COVID-19.

Comparison of Children's Health Status

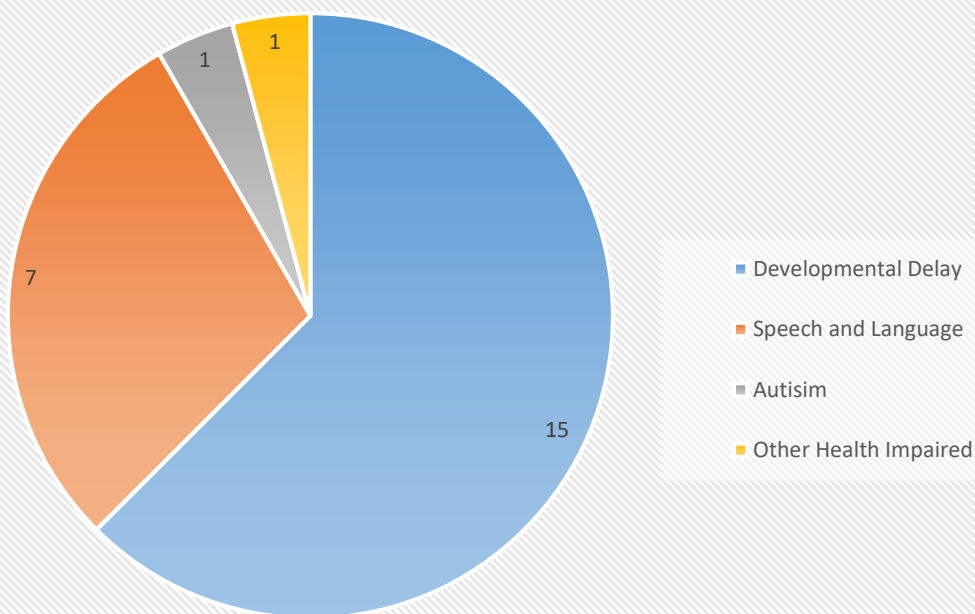
